

Operating Room Environment

 Intraoperative UV radiation has not been shown to decrease overall SSI risk.



Laminar Airflow Ventilation in the OR

- Some controversy exists between engineers and clinicians over the need for laminar airflow ventilation in the OR to further minimize airborne infection.
- Careful mathematical analyses of airflow suggest laminar airflow is not necessary when the previously noted recommendations are met.
 Clinical studies are confirmatory.
- Similarly, the use of UV light to cleanse the room air is no longer recommended.

Operating Room Environment

Ventilation

 All ventilation or air conditioning systems in hospitals, including those in operating rooms, should have two filter beds in series, with the efficiency of the first filter bed being >30% and that of the second filter bed being >90%.

Operating Table

- Simple standard couch
- Height adjustment
- Operating on the head and neck
- It may be moved out during cleaning
- It can be fixed into the floor with removable top sections to permit the different positions of the patient

Electrical System

 Must have multiple electrical outlets available from separate circuits.



This decreases the chances for a blown fuse and prevents loss of all power if a fuse is blown.

Lights

Two Types:

 General Room Lights- used for illumination of the OR. Must be recessed into the ceiling to avoid dust collection.

 Operating Spot Light- used for illumination of the operative site

Supply/Equipment Rooms

 Anesthesia supply -holds anesthesia supply items and extra equipment needed by anesthesiologists.



Supply/Equipment Rooms



Piped-in gas System

 For the delivery of compressed air, oxygen, nitrous oxide etc.... from a central source and not from tanks in the individual ORs.

Vacuum System

 Provides suction used by anesthesia and surgical team members during surgical procedures.

Supply/Equipment Rooms

- ☐ Sterile supply:
- Clean climate-controlled room
- > In a restricted area
- Used to store sterile supplies such as sterile gowns, gloves, and sponges

Supply/Equipment Rooms





Clean Storage Room

- Where, equipments are stored:
- ➤ Equipment for surgical procedures, such as x-ray equipment, stirrups
- ➤ Monitoring equipment

Cabinets may be built-in or free standing.

Support Areas in the OR

 Preoperative area- patient holding/receiving area: where patients wait for surgery.

 Dressing (locker) rooms- used by staff personnel to change into OR (surgical) attire and personal hygiene

Support Areas in the OR

☐ Central administrative area-"front desk"-control center for (OR) operations.

- □Offices- used to conduct daily activities by the secretary, operating room supervisor, and his/her assistant.
- □Scrub Room- enclosed area, adjacent to the OR suites in a restricted area.

Decontamination Room

- ☐A room located between one or more OR suites that usually contains:
- √ washer sterilizers
- √ sinks
- ✓ all necessary cleaning aids used for cleaning and decontamination of instruments following surgical procedures.

Decontamination Room

 Sterile Core- area adjacent to OR's where instruments may be sterilized if needed during OR procedures.

 Scrub Room- enclosed area, adjacent to the OR suites in a restricted area.

OR Communication Systems

 Voice intercommunication system (Intercom)-Used for paging the surgeon for emergency assistance

- ☐ Computers- Used for:
- Documentation of care
- Scheduling
- Retrieval of lab results
- Storage of surgeons preference information
- Tracking of supplies and equipment
